



CACIQUES DE VENEZUELA

MARA

Mara fué el cacique de la zona del Lago, el mismo que no quiso someterse al acuerdo logrado entre el cacique Manaure y los españoles, gracias al cual, en julio de 1527, fué fundada la primera ciudad occidental de Venezuela, Santa Ana de Coro.

El caribe Mara, que operaba en los contornos, era el prototípico del guerrero heróico, rebelde a los españoles, asimismo insigne defensor del Lago, de la Sierra y de sus alrededores.

Su vida fue un canto de gestas heroicas que supieron cumplir la extraordinaria odisea de rechazar por varios años la invasión de los conquistadores. Su tierra registró en él uno de los más decididos y heroicos gladiadores indigenas.

Mara, en una ocasión, logró rechazar y poner en fuga simultáneamente en la zona costera del Lago y en las fértiles llanuras de Perijá, a dos compactos y poderosos cuerpos de infantería española.

Murió en la lucha, legando a aquella tierra, tenazmente defendida por él, la resonancia de su nombre: Maracaibo.

MARA

Mara was the Indian chief of the Lake district who would not accept the pact between chief Manaure and Spaniards, which led to the foundation of Santa Ana de Coro, the first western city in Venezuela, in July 1527.

The carib Mara, who fought nearby, was a typical heroic warrior who rebelled against the Spaniards, and it was he who stalwartly defended the Lake, the Sierra and their surroundings.

His heroic life was an extraordinary odyssey of continuous repulsion of the invading forces of the Spanish Conquistadores. His land witnessed one of the bravest and most decided native gladiators.

On one occasion Mara was able to repel and put into flight two compact and powerful corps of Spanish infantry, simultaneously on the coast of the Lake and in the fertile valleys of Perijá.

He died fighting-bequeathing to that soil, which he had so fiercely defended, the resonance of this name: Maracaibo.
