HIGHLIGHTS OF LAS VEGAS, NEVADA, REUNION

July 2011

Dear Friends,

The 41st Annual Creole Annuitants Reunion was in Las Vegas, Nevada, at the Flamingo Hotel. About 163 former associates, friends and guests attended. Among those were 51 sons and daughters.

Annuitants, sons, daughters, guests and friends all enjoyed our gathering at the 3,700 room Flamingo Hotel, located in the heart of the Las Vegas Strip. This is the largest hotel we have used, so everything you expect of Las Vegas was available. The many activities and numbers of people at the Hotel were unparalleled as were the casinos, and other facilities. The Flamingo has been a center-Strip icon for more than 60 years.

Welcoming everyone at the registration desk were Carol Powers, Pat Carrington, Alice Kerr, Clyde Pogson, Bob Tolleson and Capt. Moore.

This year's special guests (three couples) from Venezuela were: Julio & Graciela Cisneros, Santos & Vicki Gilarranz and Armando & Elisa Segnini. This year was the conclusion of the 21 year program which brought 103 guests to our reunions. During those years over 240 sponsors participated in this effort to say thanks for the warm Venezuelan hospitality during the many great years working and living in Venezuela.

At the banquet, Armando took a few minutes to make the following comments.

"Dear Friends, It is a great pleasure, honor and privilege, to attend this reunion with the kind invitation from all of you. Members of the Creole Annuitants Association, Julio Cisneros and Graciela, Santos Gilarranz and Vicki, Elisa and myself, Armando Segnini, want to express our thankfulness for this sensitive gesture.

We are proud, very proud, to be recipients of the Creole culture, a legacy the pioneers, ancestors and you left to us. Based on those principles we were modeled as employees and citizens, way of being we included to our families.

Early after nationalization of the Venezuelan oil industry, we developed and established the fundamental values of Lagoven, the successor of Creole: ethic, excellence, responsibility, mutual commitment and social commitment

There is no shortage of activities in Las Vegas due to the numerous hotels, casinos, shows, and tours. So there were lots of things going on each day.

The Creole spirit lives on even though our guest program ends with 103 guests attending over 21 years.

On Thursday evening our Banquet was attended by 156 people. The culinary selection was a Plated Dinner of Heirloom Tomato, Fresh Mozzarella, Micro Basil, Chive Oil, Aged Balsamic Grilled Breast of Chicken, Braised Young Carrots, Cipollini Onions, Lemon Caper Cream, Fresh Baked Artesian Rolls and Butter, Chocolate Banana Bliss, Organic Honey Banana Ganache layered with Caramelized Bananas, served with Vanilla Sauce, Fresh Brewed Coffee, Decaffeinated Coffee, Herbal Teas and Iced Tea.

Mr. Truman Bell, Senior Program Officer, ExxonMobil Corporation was the evening speaker. A native of Coleman, Texas, he received a B.S. in Mathematics and a MEd in Educational Administration from Tarleton State University. Truman and his wife, Connie, have three children and live in Keller, Texas.

Truman has a forty year work history including university student services, industry human resources, corporate recruiting, public affairs and foundation administration. In his early career, he served as Director of Student Financial Aid and Placement at Tarleton State University and Director of Career Services at Texas Tech University.

Having been with ExxonMobil for 30 years, he has served in various positions, including Director of College Relations where he coordinated the recruiting of new hires and interns, an on-campus recruiting program at 100 universities.

Truman Bell is ExxonMobil's Senior Program Officer for education and diversity where he coordinates community relations activities and manages education and diversity community investment programs. These programs include support to higher education and K-12 education,

and initiatives that foster improvement of teaching and learning in science, technology, engineering and mathematics, and inspire young people to pursue careers in those fields. Truman serves on boards and advisory committees of organizations such as the National Action Council for Minorities in Engineering, SECME, Inc., the National Science Teachers Association, National Engineering Week, and the Texas Business and Education Coalition. He is also a member of the Alpha Phi Omega National Service Fraternity.

Mr. Bell spoke of how ExxonMobil is “Taking on the world’s toughest energy challenges.” and “Securing the Future of Energy”. **He summarized the 2010 Results across all key financial and non-financial parameters as:**

ExxonMobil delivered earnings of \$30.5 billion in 2010, which included a record result in our Chemical business. We continue to leverage our strong integrated business model for earnings and efficiency. Earnings are supported by project start-ups and strong operational performance. Increasing Ownership ... The earnings per share are enhanced by a robust share purchase program. Each share of ExxonMobil has an interest in 28% more production volumes, 32% more proved reserves, 14% more refinery throughput and 15% more chemical prime product sales than it did five years ago.

Mr. Bell mentioned the major projects that are delivering significant value through key developments and new growth opportunities. Such as: Angolan Kizomba Satellites Phase I that is expected to produce 100k bpd of oil daily. The active exploration program in the U.S. Gulf of Mexico resulting in 2.1 million net acres with exposure to multiple plays, recent discoveries at Hadrian South and Hadrian North and actively building prospect inventory.

In Alberta, Canada, the heavy oil sands projects are high-quality oil sands assets with growth opportunities such as: Largest thermal in site heavy oil project in the world at Cold Lake. Syncrude advancing activities to expand synthetic crude production. Kearl project developing world-class sands resource and significant oil sands acreage position in the Athabasca region.

Hydraulic Fracturing is a combination of technologies that is unlocking vast shale gas potential in a safe and environmentally responsible way. This was presented in a short movie.

In closing, Mr. Bell explained how globally ExxonMobil is providing funding to improve basic **Math and Science Education**. ExxonMobil is supporting programs that encourage students to take an active interest in science technology, engineering and mathematics education and careers. This effort is motivating all students to learn and perform well in math and science courses. They are providing teachers with professional development opportunities in math and science. In addition they are supporting the development of highly qualified teachers in the math and science fields.

This effort is being focused through the **Sally Ride Science Academy** that engages Teachers and Counselors to Inspire Students in Science and Math in six states, and programs at 22 universities.

In Houston, ExxonMobil just announced that following extensive research into best practices in workplace design and benchmarking the world's top facilities; they are proceeding with construction of a new ExxonMobil office campus. It is to be located on a company-owned 385-acre wooded site near the intersection of I-45 and the Hardy Toll Road. This complex is for eight to ten thousand employees. Currently employees working in a variety of locations and functions across the Houston area will be moving in by 2014.

Mr. Bell took a few questions from the audience. As a thank you, and for sharing his time at our reunion, a Nambe bowl was presented to Mr. Bell as a souvenir of his time with our group.

We wish to thank all those gentlemen who contribute to the success of this reunion; by taking tickets, delivering gifts, and being available to help out as needed.
